- While offering beautiful views of the beach and the Gulf of Mexico, the view inside, not so much... So, the owner's hired an interior designer and us!









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Owner Goals

- Update the entire 3 bedroom, 2 bath condo with 100% remodel of everything, especially the mirrored walls and vintage flooring and doors.....
- Enlarge the master bath shower and create a walk-in closet
- Turn the laundry room 180 degrees to allow for a new storage closet
- Remodel kitchen to add storage, remove soffits and 2 walls to open up the space.
- Add a large island that would contain a farm sink & DW
- Add a bar for entertaining


Other Notable Features

Obstacles & Solutions

Upon demo, we found an obstacle that required a re-design of the master bath, laundry and closet. A chase for the building that contained the laundry exhaust vent that was impossible to move!






New laundry area


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We also tweaked the kitchen design.

NOTE – When remodeling kitchens in condo's, it is difficult to meet all NKBA rules due to the owner requests in the limited space


Drain pipe chase to remain We installed a shallow depth pantry in front of it

Fridge will be to the right of chase



In order to relocate the sink from the wall to the island, we needed to utilize a system to remove the waste water since we cannot cut the slab in a Post-Tension structure.

We installed a pump near the sink base to pump the water vertically and then horizontally to tie-in to the existing waste line. Because of the island tapered design, we had a lot of open space behind the sink so we installed the pump in that area to keep sink base uncluttered.
